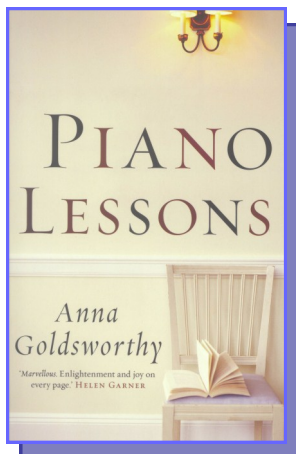

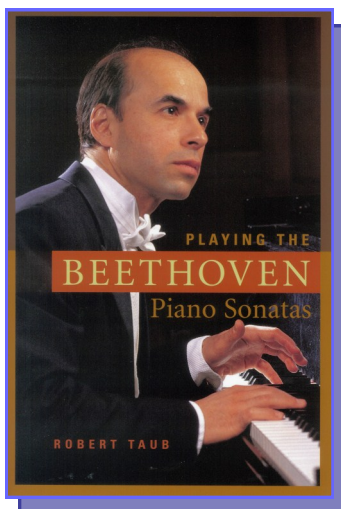


***Piano Lessons* by Anna Goldsworthy (2nd Edition)**

In this remarkable memoir, Anna Goldsworthy recalls her first steps towards a life in music, from childhood piano lessons with a local jazz muso to international success as a concert pianist. As she discovers passion and ambition, and confronts doubt and disappointment, she learns about much more than tone and technique. This is a story of the getting of wisdom, tender and bittersweet.

With wit and affection, Goldsworthy captures the hopes and uncertainties of youth, the fear and exhilaration of performing, and the complex bonds between teacher and student. An unforgettable cast of characters joins her: her family; her friends and rivals; and her teacher, Mrs Sivan, who inspires and challenges her in equal measure, and who transforms what seems an impossible dream into something real and sustaining.

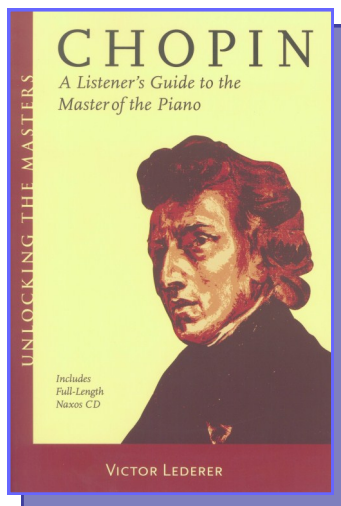


***Playing The Beethoven Piano Sonatas* by Robert Taub**

Acclaimed pianist Robert Taub offers the insights of a passionate musician who performs all 32 of Beethoven's well-loved piano sonatas in concert worldwide, bringing a "fresh perspective on Beethoven," as the *New York Times* put it. In this book, he shares his intimate understanding of these works with listeners and players alike.

He explains what he has learned from Beethoven's own writings and autograph scores: Beethoven's convictions about the integrity of each work; the refinements he made in his sketchbooks; his outspoken opinions about tempo, pedalling, and dynamics; his humour; and his insistence that his publishers get the details right. Taub also considers each of the thirty-two sonatas grouped into nine programmes, looking beyond just "getting the notes" to convey the essence of each work and to understand its place in the evolution of Beethoven's revolutionary artistry.

Chopin - A Listener's Guide to the Master of the Piano takes a detailed tour through the life and oeuvre of the sovereign master of the keyboard. The composer's metabolic adaptation of the melodic structures of Italian opera and the folk music of his native Poland for the resources of the piano are examined in detail, as are the originality and boldness he displayed throughout his tragically short, astonishing career.

The book is accompanied by a CD containing 15 complete compositions (and one full movement from his Piano Sonata No. 2) performed by pianist Idil Biret.
